JAZZ ON THE PIER (PART 2) JUNE 18 - The Portland segment of the 2010 Ocho Rios Hazz Festival will again be held on the Ken Wright Pier at the marina on Friday, June 18 from 7 p.m. Considered one of the Marina's Signature Events, the "Jazz on the Pier" night brings together a highly entertaining collection of international and Jamaican jazz and blues artists giving their all for charity. This years beneficiary is the Muirton Boys Home in East Portland. The event is under the joint sponsorship of the Custos or Portland Magistrate's Association and the Ocho Rios Jazz Festival, an outreach programme dedicated to promoting the musical arts in Jamaica. Tickets, at \$1,000 JAD are available at the marina office.

GOING TO CUBA? GET INSURED — Heading off to that forbidden place to the north of Jamaica? Better be sure you're insured as Cuban authorities from May 1 are insisting all visitors must have adequate medical insurance. If you don't have any, the Castro Brothers will be happy to sell you coverage for your stay there at the rate of \$3.00 USD per day per person through their Cubatur agency. It's a bit higher than that if you're over 70 years old (or is it young?). Our Cuba intel sources say the enforcement of the new rule is a bit spotty but you can be certain it will improve as time passes. Oh, and yes, the Cubans will not accept policies from any USA insurance underwriter! (No big surprise there!) Port Antonio is oft referred to as the "back door to Cuba" for it's proximity to scenic Santiago de Cuba in the island's southeastern sector.

NAVY ISLAND GETTING FACELIFT— Several vendors have already expressed an interest in taking over the Crusoe Beach facility at Port Antonio's Navy Island. The area from the main island docks to the beach on the west side of the property is about to get a proper facelift after years of neglect.
