RUNNING TIME

The show will run 2 hours with one 10-minute intermission.

HISTORICAL NOTE

In 1958 Errol Flynn traveled to Cuba to film the self-produced B film Cuban Rebel Girls where he met Fidel Castro. Flynn became an enthusiastic supporter of the Cuban Revolution and wrote a series of articles documenting his time with Castro. On January 1,1959 President Batista fled Cuba with Castro arriving in Havana on January 8th. As Flynn's views of the revolution became increasingly controversial back home in America, he defended Castro on CBS Front Page Challenge and in a short film, Cuban Story: The Truth About Fidel Castro Revolution, which was his last known work as an actor.

By mid-1959, however, Flynn began to state publicly that Castro's revolution had gone too far and that Castro was no better than Batista. In October 1959 Flynn died of a heart attack and his autobiography was published a year later with very little mention of his time in Cuba. Errol & Fidel imagines what might have brought these two men together and what tore them apart amidst the chaos and passion of the Cuban Revolution.
